As a steward of community resources, we support a quality of life that reflects the diverse values, traditions, beauty, and dreams of New Mexico.

WHAT WE DO We serve both donors and beneficiaries and connect philanthropists (large and small) to the needs and aspirations of cities, towns, and pueblos across our state. We pull together people, ideas, and resources; serve as a champion for rural communities; strengthen nonprofit leaders and organizations; and build and distribute resources to the underserved, underprivileged and vulnerable. For thirty years, NMCF has served all thirty-three counties in New Mexico by identifying community needs, as well as designing and leading broad-based initiatives to meet those needs.

Whether you were born here or moved here, you've surely been asked by an outsider, "Why New Mexico?" Whether it's enchantment of the vast New Mexico landscape, a special connection to our state's diverse, deeply rooted cultures, or a love of your neighbors and community, we want to share with you what keeps us steadfast and true to helping New Mexico thrive. New Mexico Community Foundation serves our entire state, and this report tells some of the stories of our leadership, community development and philanthropy.

In 1983, we started with boots on the ground and zero dollars for endowment. We now manage nearly \$30 million in various funds and assets. We are most gratified, however, by the impact we have made by leveraging resources to meet the challenges of New Mexico's thirty-three counties. In the last two years alone, we have granted over \$7.5 million statewide. In our 30 years serving as *your* community foundation, we have granted over \$60 million.

Entering our next 30 years, we are particularly excited about continuing the four tenets that direct our work:

- **We grow philanthropy in every corner of the state.** We help every philanthropist (large and small) achieve their charitable goals and fund their passions. By connecting donors with beneficiaries, we build resources and distribute them when and where they are needed most.
- **We nurture and cultivate local leadership while providing resources and knowledge to address New Mexico's most pressing issues.** We have identified three areas requiring urgent action in our state: improving the health, safety and economic security of women and girls; supporting community-defined development in rural areas; and supporting Native American education and leadership.
- **We strengthen New Mexico's nonprofits and build their capacity to serve.** Through our vibrant and growing Fiscal Sponsorship program, we incubate innovative ideas, build organizational capacity, and help fledgling projects take flight.
- **We build and distribute resources to underserved, underprivileged and vulnerable populations.** We serve as a statewide philanthropic first responder by providing resources to individuals, families and communities in immediate need.

We continue our work with immeasurable support from donors, staff, board members, and the many loyal friends of NMCF. We foster relationships with local, statewide and national partners in philanthropy, and together we make New Mexico a better place to live.

If, as Rudolfo Anaya wrote, "the river, wind, clouds and varied earth [of] New Mexico got into [your] blood and [you] never thought of leaving," then let us serve as your community foundation. Together, we thrive.

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

*Meeting immediate needs
close to your heart*

A Donor Advised Fund (DAF) is a philanthropic vehicle established with New Mexico Community Foundation allowing donors to make charitable contributions, receive a prompt tax benefit, and recommend grants. DAFs act as charitable savings accounts so that donors can contribute to their DAFs as frequently as they like. NMCF is home to more than 250 charitable funds and foundations created by generous individuals, families, businesses, and organizations to support the causes they care about in New Mexico.



FUND HIGHLIGHT

Lynda Taylor and Robert Haspel

Lynda Taylor and Robert Haspel are known for their work in environmental justice, education, and statewide philanthropy. In particular, they have responded to the needs of students with learning differences, such as dyslexia, putting in motion a comprehensive initiative, based on multi-sensory methods, perfected at The Shelton School in Dallas, the largest school in the world for students with language-based learning differences. Funding through their NMCF Donor Advised Fund has supported multi-sensory language programs at Desert Montessori School and Los Alamos High School and helped create the May Center for Learning, a school and outreach center in Santa Fe dedicated exclusively to students with language-based learning differences. The May Center continues to offer Shelton training to teachers from the Northern New Mexico community and beyond, in addition to community seminars, tutoring programs, and summer programs designed to foster academic and social-emotional skills for students who learn differently.





ENDOWMENT HIGHLIGHT

National Hispanic Cultural Center

The National Hispanic Cultural Center (NHCC), sitting on the banks of the Rio Grande in Albuquerque's historic Barelas neighborhood, serves as a national focal point for the study, advancement, presentation, and preservation of Hispanic arts and culture. The NHCC Foundation trusts NMCF with their endowment, and the 375,000 visitors that visit NHCC each year are a testament to the legacy that has been defined through their endowment.

ENDOWMENTS AND PLANNED GIFTS

Creating a legacy of support

An endowment is a fund composed of gifts and bequests, with the principal maintained intact and invested, creating a source of long-term income for this and future generations. THE AGNES WILLIAMS DELGADO STREET COMPOUND BEQUEST

Growing into another thirty years

After graduating from Cornell University in 1945, New Mexico Community Foundation donor Agnes Williams traveled west to northern New Mexico to work on the Manhattan Project in Los Alamos. As a single woman, she purchased a home in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristos in pastoral Nambé. Soon thereafter, she purchased the Santa Fe Business College, then located behind the Scottish Rite Center, and operated the school until 1986. In 1986, Agnes purchased a complex of buildings located at 110 Delgado Street near historic Canyon Road in Santa Fe where she moved the college operations until 1990 when the school closed permanently.

Agnes had a clear vision: to provide commercial property at reasonable prices to small businesses that needed an opportunity to grow and excel. Later in her life, she decided to look for a worthy partner as beneficiary of her philanthropic wishes. Her prerequisite was to find an organization that would put the assets to good use and carry on her legacy of entrepreneurialism in the spirit of hard work, integrity and generosity.

The Agnes Williams Delgado Street Compound is comprised of four separate, historic adobe buildings on a ½ acre with heirloom fruit trees, a walled courtyard, grassy lawns and ample parking. Agnes has bequeathed this property to New Mexico Community Foundation. The foundation's office will move to the compound one day in the future. Thank you, Agnes, for providing us the resources to grow into our next 30 years of statewide philanthropy!

When women and girls thrive, communities thrive.

NewMexicoWomen.Org Mission: *To advance opportunities for women and girls statewide so they can lead self-sufficient, healthy, and empowered lives*

Women comprise 51% of New Mexico's population; 24% of these women live in poverty. Our teen pregnancy rate is second in the nation. Shockingly, 1 in 4 of the women we know in New Mexico will experience sexual assault during her lifetime. Women make up the vast majority of domestic violence cases reported in New Mexico. Out of 1,000 New Mexico girls interviewed, more than half have reported being the victim of bullying. In other words, many women and girls in our state face huge challenges while struggling with limited access to resources.

Fortunately, there is a passionate cadre of women and men who are committed to supporting women and girls so they may lead self-sufficient, healthy, and empowered lives. New Mexico Community Foundation's initiative, NewMexicoWomen.Org(NMW.O), quickly moved from being a humble grassroots project to a major player in the landscape of programs that support women and girls. We believe that when women and girls thrive, families and communities thrive.

NMW.O, the first statewide women's fund of its kind in New Mexico, seeks to define issues affecting women and girls in our state, increase the amount of philanthropic dollars that are directed towards gender issues, and improve outcomes for our women and girls.

In order to fulfill our mission and reach our goals, NMW.O employs a three-pronged strategy:

Educate – We concentrate public attention on the issues affecting women and girls with a focus on influencing philanthropy and policy.

Lead – We promote and cultivate alliances among nonprofits, funders and other sectors in order to maximize resources and foster collaboration.

Invest – We build resources and leverage philanthropic investments in programs serving women and girls statewide through our donor education and strategic grant making efforts.

FUND HIGHLIGHT

Northeastern Regional Community Foundation Fund

New Mexico Community Foundation manages a pool of charitable funds that benefit Northeastern New Mexico by providing grants to nonprofit organizations and educational institutions. The Northeastern Regional Community Fund focuses on San Miguel, Mora, Guadalupe, Colfax, Harding, Union, and Quay Counties. The field of interest funds are granted to organizations who offer programs about health awareness and disease prevention such as obesity and substance abuse prevention, nutrition education, and programs related to diabetes and cardiovascular risk factors, prenatal care, and asthma.

Grants are made to support, strengthen, and sustain an organization's new or expanding programs, pilot projects, and capacity building abilities. In order to make the best use of available funds, programs that address the needs of underserved populations, are innovative, responsive to changing community needs, collaborative, and/or are strongly community-oriented receive the highest priority.

RURAL COMMUNITIES AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Supporting community-defined development

Roughly 75% of all communities in New Mexico have 500 or fewer residents.

If these communities are experiencing chronic and severe challenges like economic dislocation, discrimination, corruption, poverty, unemployment or outmigration, they may lack community capacity to engage in a level of development necessary to reverse their declining situation. Many communities experience these challenges for one or more generations and face the need for sustained, robust and long-term development.

Finding the dollars to effectively and efficiently support and sustain community-defined development and capacity building efforts is a difficult endeavor. Without such help, it may be impossible for lower capacity communities to engage in their own development and achieve prosperity.

NMCF works with partner communities on strategies to increase local charitable giveback, leverage outside funding and grow permanent funds for the community and its long-term development. We also work to provide leadership, organizational training and technical assistance in support of both resource mobilization and economic development.

NATIVE AMERICAN EDUCATION AND LEADERSHIP

Investing in success

Native American college students continually have the lowest rates in the nation of enrollment in and graduation from institutes of higher education. In New Mexico, these figures are even lower. Native American's graduation rate from New Mexico's public universities hovers at approximately 18%, and their graduation rate from community colleges at 25%.



FUND HIGHLIGHTS

Native American Preparatory Scholars

The Native American Preparatory Scholars (NAPS) Fund, an initiative and endowment fund of New Mexico Community Foundation, aims to increase the number of New Mexico Native American students who aspire to, are prepared for, and graduate from institutes of higher education. The NAPS Fund provides support to programs at the secondary, and collegiate level so that Native American students will be more likely to enroll in *and* graduate from college.

In 2013, NMCF granted out its first round of grants to five colleges and non-profits serving native students. Through this fund, NMCF envisions brighter futures, increased opportunities for higher paying jobs, and more economic security for aspiring Native students.

Community Learning Exchange

The Community Learning Exchange (CLE) is a national network of people, organizations, and communities who share their wisdom and collective leadership approaches in order to better address critical social issues, with a racial equity focus. CLE intends to break the isolation people often feel working on community change, and provides time and space for deep conversations and learning exchanges. NMCF oversees the finances and acts in an advisory capacity with Laguna Community Foundation and a core team made up of Native partners leading local trainings, events, a website (www.nmlearningexchange.org), and activities aimed at increasing collective leadership and shared experiences and knowledge.

FISCAL SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

Building capacity in new projects

New Mexico Community Foundation offers a unique entrepreneurial partnership that incubates innovative ideas and assists new community charitable projects without nonprofit status. Supporting the Fiscal Sponsorship Program, NMCF serves as the umbrella tax-exempt agent for these unincorporated groups to help them develop their ideas by providing a wide range of services including programmatic support, financial oversight and the ability to receive donations from individuals, foundations, and government.

NMCF currently has nearly 50 Fiscal Sponsorship clients for whom NMCF provides necessary financial and administrative support so that these groups can grow their resources and meet their longer-term mission of one day incorporating as a New Mexico based organization.

Emergency funds supporting the greater good

When a grandmother in northern New Mexico learned she had been given custody of her four young grandchildren, she welcomed the opportunity with an open heart. However, on her limited income, she was unable to purchase a bed for each child, as is required by state law. Elsewhere, a young family was thriving until the father was paralyzed in a car accident. His wife reduced her employment in order to care for him, further jeopardizing the family's financial stability. In another tragic occurrence, a talented potter fell and broke both wrists. Though she had always supported herself through her art, she now struggled to pay her utilities and mortgage.

All are true stories of New Mexicans who found themselves in need of a good neighbor in times of crisis.

Using emergency funds from New Mexico Community Foundation, hope was restored to these and hundreds of other lives as each potential for an emergency crisis was averted. For over ten years, NMCF has made emergency grants. In 2012, NMCF dedicated \$270,264 in grants to help New Mexicans avoid dire circumstances and return to self-sufficiency.

While NMCF does not give money directly to individuals, it does provide financial assistance to nonprofit agencies to purchase needed supplies and services that help individuals or families in immediate need. Through our Vecino Fund and Land of Enchantment Fund, donors can contribute to NMCF and channel their philanthropic dollars to help New Mexico individuals and families avoid crises and emerge intact.

CHISPA AWARDS

Honoring nonprofits that accomplish a lot with very little

In 2012, New Mexico Community Foundation announced its first annual Chispa Awards, recognizing nonprofits across the state that accomplish a lot with very little. Twelve organizations that work to improve New Mexico communities each received an award and a \$7,000 unrestricted grant to use for their organization's general operations.

Chispa, which means "spark," are awards that are given annually to nonprofits that shine a light in the communities they serve. Nominations were submitted by a group of anonymous community leaders, and grants were finalized by a volunteer selection committee. None of the Chispa recipients knew their organization had been selected until the day each was presented with the award and grant. Half of the organizations selected support issues directly relating to women and girls, aligning with NewMexicoWomen.Org, NMCF's initiative to advance opportunities for women and girls in our state.

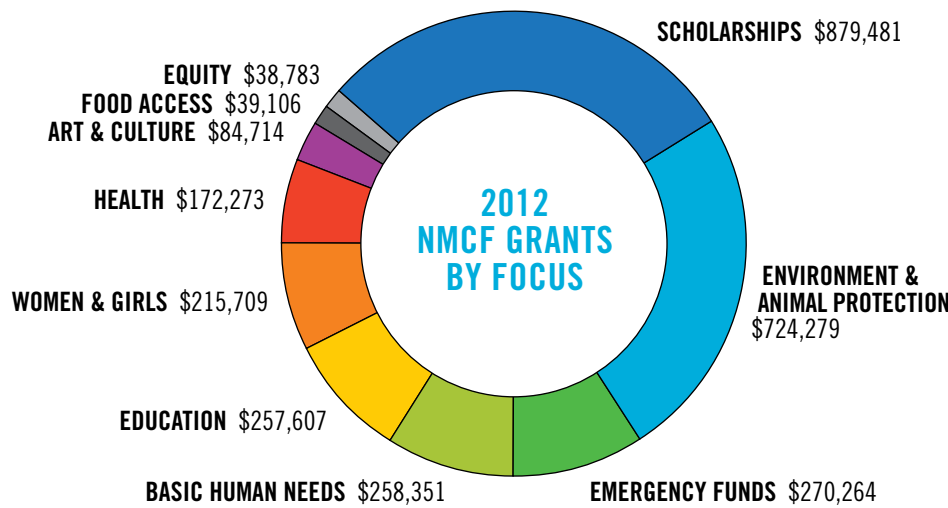

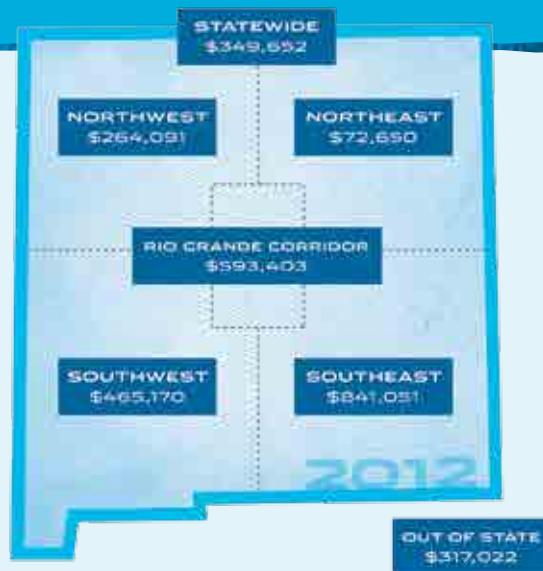
